3. Profile of skills and competences.

Intensive care of preterm infants, new-born babies, children and adolescents

This includes, in particular:

- Co-operation in reanimation and shock therapy
- Co-operation in all anaesthetic procedures
- Monitoring and care of seriously ill and respiratory insufficient preterm infants, new-born babies, children and adolescents using invasive and non-invasive methods
- Co-operation in controlling and maintaining equipment functional (monitoring, artificial respiration, catheters and related infusions systems)
- Taking blood from catheters in place, e.g. arterial catheters
- Placing gastric and duodenal tubes as well as temperature probes
- Performing and monitoring elimination procedures with catheters in place
- Co-operation in implementing and monitoring extracorporeal circulation, in particular, during renal replacement therapy and detoxication, excluding placing the required catheters
- Co-operation in pain therapy

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (3)

Particularly, hospitals, institutions that specialise in the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of diseases or in follow-up care, care of disabled persons or nursing of persons needing care or establishments that offer other health and social services, medical practitioners, home nursing services and independent practice.

Pursuit of regulated professions on a self-employed basis:

Upon notification of the district administrative authority according to Art. 36 of the *Gesundheits- und Krankenpflegegesetz (GuKG*; Health Care and Nursing Act), nurses are entitled to work on a self-employed basis.

6. OFFICIALY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Specialised training on anaesthetic nursing after completion of a training for nurses under the *Gesundheits- und Krankenpflege-Spezialaufgaben-Verordnung* (Ordinance on Special Tasks in Health Care and Nursing)

Additional Information:

Entry requirements: Diploma in paediatric nursing; admission test or interview.

In agreement with the management of the specialised course, the institution organising it decides on admission.

Duration of education: 1,000 hours (7 months)

<u>Theoretical instruction</u>: 440 hours (240 hours of basic training, 200 hours of specialised additional training) <u>Subjects of basic training</u>: Care and monitoring of patients using invasive and non-invasive methods; applied hygiene; biomedical technology and technical equipment; communication and ethics; enteral and parenteral nutrition; reanimation and shock therapy; special pharmacology; physiology and pathophysiology.

<u>Subjects of specialised additional training</u>: Specialised nursing of preterm infants and new-born babies as well as children and adolescents in intensive care; biomedical technology and technical equipment; communication and ethics; research; foundations of intensive-care therapy; artificial respiration and related therapies.

<u>Practical training</u>: 560 hours (360 hours of basic training, 200 hours of specialised additional training) at specialised departments or other organisational units of a hospital and at a nursing care institution

Education objectives:

Acquisition of knowledge and skills for taking over and performing all activities required for fulfilling the relevant specialised tasks.
